5 6 7	The regular meeting of the Heritage Greens Community Development District Board of Supervisors was held on Monday, May 19th, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. at the HGCDD Clubhouse, Naples, Florida.

16	ROLL CALL/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
17 18 19 20 21	Mr. Neil Dorrill called the meeting to order and advised that the meeting was properly noticed. A copy of the notice and affidavit are on file with the District Office at 5672 Strand Court, Naples, FL 34110. Four board members were present at the meeting establishing a quorum. Mr. Joos was present via speakerphone. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited in unison.
22 23 24	Mr. Joos' full participation via Speakerphone due to exceptional circumstances was approved on a MOTION by Mr. Meszaros and a second by Mrs. Pitts, and all in favor.
25	APPROVAL OF AGENDA
26 27	On MOTION by Mr. Shelton and a second by Mr. Meszaros the agenda was approved as presented with all in favor.

#### 1 PUBLIC COMMENT

- 2 Bill O'Reilly Crestview Way and President of the Colonial Villas Board Raised
- 3 concerns regarding speeding and the number of speed bumps on Crestview Way. He
- 4 wished to discuss the issue due to ongoing safety concerns, particularly for children
- 5 playing in the area. Mr. Meszaros shared that he had spoken with the county and
- 6 reported that Heritage Greens currently has the maximum number of speed bumps
- 7 allowed. It was noted that Mr. Neil Dorrill is looking into whether it may still be possible
- 8 to add additional speed bumps. The board was in agreement that speeding on
- 9 Crestview Way remains a significant issue. Mr. O'Reilly requested information on how
- many speeding tickets have been issued by the sheriff's department on Crestview Way.
- 11 Mr. Christopher Dorrill agreed to reach out to the sheriff to obtain that information.
- 12 Mr. O'Reilly also stated that if no additional speed bumps can be added, someone from
- the county should provide a written acknowledgment confirming that. Mr. Shelton noted
- that they should have an answer on this at the next board meeting.
- 15 Dan Anderson, President of the Crestview Condo Association, added to the discussion
- and supported addressing the speeding issue. He suggested pursuing the installation of
- a permanent speed trailer as a possible way to help deter speeding in the area.

## 18 APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES FOR APRIL 2025

- 19 The minutes were accepted as presented on a MOTION by Mr. Shelton, a second
- 20 **by Mrs. Pitts and all in favor.**

## 21 FINANCIALS - MARCH 2025

- The mid-year financials through March 31, 2025. \$345,000 in cash. \$4,300 in payables.
- 23 89% of income revenue has been received. Year to date expenses are below budget by
- 24 \$7,200.
- 25 The financials were accepted as presented on a MOTION by Mr. Shelton, second
- 26 by Mrs. Pitts, and all in favor.

#### 27 MANAGERS REPORT

- 28 A. CDD Voter Counts
- 29 The Supervisor of Elections is required by statue to report the number of active voters in
- 30 the District. There are 681 active registered voters in Heritage Greens.

#### 1 B. FY 26 Tentative Budget

- 2 The projected 2026 budget includes an anticipated overall increase of 8%, with a
- 3 proposed assessment increase of 12%. This equates to a \$73 increase per ERU,
- 4 bringing the total assessment rate to \$649. The primary drivers of the increase are
- 5 ongoing preserve maintenance and cost-of-living adjustments associated with the
- 6 management, Envera, and landscaping contracts. Each of these contractual increases
- 7 is capped at 3%.

## 8 C. CCSO Patrol Summary

- 9 Mr. Christopher Dorrill will make a note to focus future patrol on Crestview way. He will
- 10 also look for ticket history of Crestview way.

## 11 D. Tree Trimming

- 12 The tree trimming project behind the entry wall, which separates Heritage Greens from
- the school and was approved last month, has now begun. The work is being completed
- 14 in phases and is progressing steadily.

## 15 **SUPERVISOR REQUESTS**

- 16 A red Jeep struck the front entrance camera. While the full license plate was not
- 17 captured, the last three characters were recorded. Envera wants to replace the camera
- which is why it is still dangling. Mr. Dorrill believes it can be fixed instead of replaced so
- 19 he is in discussion with them trying to get a repair instead of a \$5,000 replacement.
- 20 There continues to be an issue with someone driving over the median at the front gate.
- 21 Mr. Shelton has spoken with the landscaper, who suggested installing plastic poles set
- 22 in concrete-filled pots as a deterrent to prevent vehicles from bypassing the gate in this
- 23 manner. Mr. Dorrill is currently waiting for the proposal. Mr. Meszaros asked if a black
- 24 fence would be preferred over the poles.

#### 25 **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

26 No public comments were received at this time.
